Editor's Annual Report | Central European History | 2023

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This report summarizes aspects of *CEH*'s operations for the 2023 calendar year. It provides highlights of the year's publications and some statistics concerning submissions, which were gathered for us by *CEH*'s publisher, Cambridge University Press.

The 2023 publication year, in brief

This year was a healthy one for submissions, in terms both of quality and number. We received 59 manuscripts, 14 of which (or 24%) were accepted for publication following editorial and peer review.

In June 2023, CEH was pleased to publish a special issue: "The GDR's Global Border" (guest editors Ned Richardson-Little and Lauren Stokes). Guest editor Frank Biess's essay forum, "Holocaust Memory and Postcolonialism: Transatlantic Perspectives on the Debate," appeared in that same issue, we are very glad to report. CEH thanks these colleagues for bringing these projects to the journal.

Book reviews

Associate Editor for book reviews, Mirna Zakić, commissioned 99 reviews (one of two books, so 100 books in total). Authors of 33 of the reviewed books were women, 60 were men, and seven books had two or more authors or editors. Among reviewers, 48 were women, 51 were men. The reviewers work in the US, Canada, UK, Ireland, Germany, Austria, Switzerland, Luxembourg, Italy, Poland, Hungary, and Australia.
